As one of Europe's leading research universities, UZH sets international standards and attracts top talent by offering comprehensive support for excellence in research. Conducting high-quality research is only possible with cooperation, interaction and communication at all levels. UZH therefore maintains numerous interdisciplinary research programs and networks.

Research Priorities and Networks

UZH is currently funding five University Research Priority Programs (URPPs) to create and promote outstanding interdisciplinary networks and support promising early-career researchers in areas that benefit society:

- Development and Learning
 Adaptive brain circuits in development and learning
- Digital Religion(s)
 Communication, interaction and transformation in the digital society
- Equality of Opportunity
 Economic and social causes of inequality
- Human Reproduction
 Legal, medical and social
 requirements of parenthood
- Rare Diseases
 Development of new therapies for treating rare diseases

UZH is also the home institution of the National Center of Competence in Research (NCCR) Evolving Language and participates in ten other NCCRs. Our research is further boosted by a range of Centers of Competence, the TRANSFORM funding line, and numerous funding opportunities for PhD candidates, postdocs, and experienced researchers.

A Hub for Medical Excellence

UZH carries out first-rate medical research and teaching in close cooperation with the four university hospitals and ETH Zurich. These six institutions combine to form a unique knowledge and health hub where research, teaching and healthcare provision converge. One example of this cooperation is precision medicine in oncology. Four centers – the Tumor Profiler Center, the Comprehensive Cancer Center Zurich, the Operating Room X and The LOOP Zurich – are advancing research together in this field.

Teaching and Learning

On the Pulse

UZH offers students an excellent environment full of opportunities and a level of diversity that is unprecedented in Switzerland. We are also constantly advancing our teaching methods in line with the evolving needs of a society in flux – creatively, innovatively and on a wide variety of levels. The Future of Teaching at UZH initiative was launched to further bolster this approach.

Quality Standards in Teaching Development

UZH promotes innovative teaching ideas and fosters a lively teaching community. By introducing the UZH Curriculum, we established university-wide quality standards for developing attractive academic programs. According to these criteria, the future of teaching at UZH is research-based, goal-oriented, engaging, individualized, transdisciplinary and international.

An International Environment

The UZH community is diverse and international. Almost half of our professors, 45 percent of employees and one-fifth of students are from abroad. Most of our international students come from Germany, China and Italy.

Student Exchanges

UZH has agreements on student exchanges with over 250 partner universities around the world. We also offer various joint-degree and double-degree programs with selected partner universities and promote international short programs such as summer schools, winter schools and internships abroad. In 2024, 579 exchange students studied at UZH, while 326 UZH students went on a stay abroad.

Studying across Disciplines

Established in 2021, the School for Transdisciplinary Studies offers interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary courses in forward-looking topics such as sustainability, digitalization and innovation to students across all faculties.

Innovation and Entrepreneurship

Shaping Business and Society

Zurich is at the heart of one of Europe's most innovative regions thanks to its close-knit network of leading educational and research institutions as well as robust knowledge and technology transfer processes. The city ranks first in the Smart City Index issued by the World Competitiveness Center.

Innovative findings and developments from UZH serve to advance politics and society. With a strategic focus on life sciences, space and aviation, digitalization, artificial intelligence and healthy longevity, UZH innovations stimulate future-oriented industries such as biotech, medtech and ICT. University research, in turn, benefits from the many opportunities for cooperation in a dynamic environment.

UZH Innovation Hub

The UZH Innovation Hub plays a pivotal role in fostering innovation at the university. It actively supports junior researchers and UZH students from the initial idea phase to prototype development right through to testing and practical implementation. We provide hands-on assistance to researchers, helping them transform their scientific discoveries into marketable products and services. Our support encompasses customized coaching and entrepreneurial skill training at various levels, along with early-stage financial assistance programs. Additionally, we offer guidance to researchers eager to launch their own startups.

161 Spin-Offs

Spin-off companies are a key instrument when it comes to translating university research into business practice. A total of 161 UZH spin-offs have been founded since 1999. As a sign of our strong affiliation and support, we have been awarding our UZH Startup label to spin-offs and startups since 2017.





Total International Students (degree-seeking)







UZH works hand in hand with universities and partners around the world to conduct impactful research and innovation, offer top-quality education and tackle complex challenges.

International University Networks

UZH is an active member of various international organizations and networks in research, teaching, innovation and other important areas of higher education.

- The League of European Research Universities (LERU) is a strong advocate for upholding sound conditions for research – especially basic research – and teaching.
- Una Europa aims to transform and innovate higher education and to draw on collective strengths to create a university of the future.
- Universitas 21 is the leading global network of research-intensive universities with the aim to advance the internationalization of education and the exchange of experiences.

Strategic Partnerships with Universities

In addition to engaging in major international networks, UZH maintains strategic partnerships with select universities to address global challenges, create joint academic programs, foster dialogue with key stakeholders and learn from each other at an institutional level.

In 2022, UZH introduced the UZH Global Funding Scheme, which helps researchers establish international connections within existing networks. Its aim is to maximize the benefits of collaborative synergies and bolster UZH's international network.

Leading House Asia Pacific

Building on its long-standing engagement in the Asia-Pacific region, UZH has been appointed as Leading House Asia Pacific by the State Secretariat for Education, Research and Innovation (SERI) for the 2025 to 2028 period. As Leading House, UZH will promote and facilitate scientific, educational and innovation collaborations between Switzerland and 15 countries across the Asia-Pacific region.








Student Mobility



By Organization


